The Vermeer Windmill, at 126 feet, anchors this twenty-three building complex. A tour of the Village includes a guided tour of the mill (including the grinding and observation level) as well as the Wyatt Earp House, a log cabin, the Werkplaats, a pottery shop, Van Spanckeren's General Store, Beason-Blommers Grist Mill, Dutch bakery, and gift shop.
